

LIVING IN THE CVRD

Welcome to North Oyster/Diamond: Electoral Area H

North Oyster/Diamond is located in Electoral Area H and your Director is Mary Marcotte.

The CVRD is governed by a Board comprised of appointed directors from four municipalities and an elected director from each of the nine electoral areas.

The regional district provides a broad range of services to its residents. While a small number of these services are mandated by the Province (solid waste, emergency planning, land use planning), the majority of services provided by the CVRD are determined by the Board. However, services can only be provided with the approval of the electors who will receive them.

Funds required to operate the various regional district services are generated through property taxes, fees and charges. Unlike municipalities, regional districts are required to match the costs and benefits of its services to the residents that benefit from them; this means residents pay for the services they receive.

Building & Development

There are a number of land use regulations and a BC Building Code in place aimed at protecting the environment and ensuring the health and safety of residents. Before starting a project, it is the owner's responsibility to find out what is permitted.

Development Services staff are available to assist residents with understanding requirements for their specific project and particular location. Building permits may be required for new structures over 10 square metres (108 square feet) or major renovations to existing structures.

If you are planning any work on your property involving the following, please check FIRST and contact the CVRD:

- Steep Slopes
- Land Adjacent to Water Bodies (creeks, lakes, rivers, wetlands, ocean)
- Land Clearing
- Tree Cutting or Topping
- Building Construction

Dog Licencing

All dogs four months and older must be licenced by January 31 annually. The \$25 dog licences and tags are available at:

Fireworks

The use of fireworks is limited to public special events or festivals where the person or organization has a fire safety plan and holds a valid Fireworks Discharge Permit. These permits will only be issued for events held on January 1, July 1 and October 31.

Parks & Trails

Recycling

The CVRD provides curbside recycling pickup for your area every two weeks. Recycling/garbage depots are also located at Bings Creek, Meade Creek and Peerless Road recycling centres. Collection schedules, depot locations, and information on what can be put in the blue tote are available at www.cvrd.bc.ca/recycling.

Roads

Provincial Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure is responsible for roads. To report maintenance issues call Mainroad South Island Contracting at 1.877.391.7310.

Taxes

Unlike municipalities, the CVRD does not directly bill residents for property taxes. Tax notices are sent to electoral area residents from the Surveyor of Taxes, a division of the Province of BC.

Water and Sewer

The CVRD operates 35 water and sewer systems in its electoral areas. Please check with the CVRD to determine if your property is serviced by one of these systems.
